# 6th International Molecular Immunology and Immunogenetics Congress (MIMIC-VI)

## 28–30 April 2025 | Acıbadem University, Istanbul, Türkiye



The 6th International Molecular Immunology and Immunogenetics Congress (MIMIC-VI) was successfully held on 28–30 April 2025 at Acıbadem University in Istanbul. Building on the MIMIC legacy since 2012, this year's congress brought together an inspiring community of immunologists, molecular biologists, and clinician-scientists to explore the future of immunology research and applications.

With participation from over **320 scientists from eight countries**, including leading institutions such as **Karolinska Institutet**, **MD Anderson Cancer Center**, **BioNTech**, and prominent Turkish universities, MIMIC-VI offered an engaging and comprehensive scientific program.



## Day 1 – Opening and Cancer Immunotherapy

The congress began with an opening ceremony moderated by **Tolga Sütlü** and **İhsan Gürsel**, followed by a keynote lecture by **Prof. Federica Sallusto (ETH Zurich)**, who presented her pioneering work on human T cell differentiation and regulation.







The morning sessions focused on the **immune response to infection**, featuring invited talks by **Cevayir Çoban** on host—pathogen interactions in malaria and **Önder Ergönül** on emerging infections. Selected oral presentations highlighted innovative research, including multiplex assays for COVID-19 antibodies and novel monoclonal antibodies targeting pain pathways.



In the afternoon, a **satellite symposium** by Sartorius examined platform development in cell therapy. The subsequent **Cancer Immunology and Immunotherapy** session included lectures by **Carsten Watzl** on NK cell cytotoxicity, **Mustafa Diken** on mRNA-based cancer therapeutics, and **Defne Bayık** on cancer—neuro—immune crosstalk. Oral abstracts detailed advances in CART manufacturing and tumor-infiltrating monocyte subsets.





The day concluded with the TSI General Assembly Meeting. At the General Assembly chaired by Prof. Günnur Deniz, the 2022–2025 activity report presented by President Prof. İhsan Gürsel, the 2022–2025 financial report presented by Treasurer Prof. Güher Saruhan Direskeneli, and the 2022–2025 audit report presented on behalf of the Auditing Committee by Prof. Umut Can Küçüksezer were all unanimously approved.

The General Assembly also included the election of the new administration of TSI. According to the results of the election, the members elected to the Board of Directors and the Auditing Committee and their respective roles are listed below:

## Day 2 – Autoimmunity, Primary Immunodeficiency, and Day of Immunology

The second day commenced with sessions on the **immune system in health and disease**, where **Bernard Malissen** and **Sidonia Fagarasan** shared insights into T cell malfunctions and lung immunity. Young scientists presented studies on germinal center B cells and tumor microenvironment analysis.

This was followed by a session on **molecular mechanisms in autoimmunity**, featuring **Andreas Radbruch** on immunological memory and tolerance. Oral presentations covered Behçet's disease, myasthenia gravis, and follicular regulatory T cells.






At midday, a **Balloon Release Ceremony** marked the **Day of Immunology** and **World Primary Immunodeficiency Week**. Each balloon symbolized a patient benefiting from early diagnosis and treatment of primary immunodeficiencies. The event included a special address by **Prof. Yıldız Camcioğlu**, Chair of the Turkish Society of Immunology's PID Working Group.



The afternoon session on **Inborn Errors of Immunity** brought contributions from **Talal Chatila**, **Elif Karakoç Aydıner**, and **Baran Erman**. The **Day of Immunology Lecture** was delivered by **Prof. Bojan Polić**, EFIS President, who discussed the immunology of sickness metabolism in viral infections.



The day closed with a vibrant **poster session**, where 103 posters were presented and evaluated by 45 referees.



Day 3 – Exosomes, Emerging Technologies, and Future Therapies

The final day opened with sessions on **Exosomes and the Immune System**, with lectures by **Edit Buzas** and **Susanne Gabrielsson** on extracellular vesicles in immunity and cancer therapy. Oral presentations explored leishmaniasis protection and immunological profiling post-vaccination.

The Emerging Technologies in Immunology session showcased Erdinç Sezgin's EMBO Young Investigator Lecture on the physics of immune cells and Begüm Horuluoğlu's work on tissue-resident memory T cells. Selected abstracts presented single-cell analyses of tumor-infiltrating lymphocytes and macrophages.



The congress concluded with a forward-looking session on **Future Vaccines and Immunotherapies**, including lectures by **Ken J. Ishii** on nucleic acid switches, **Rafet Başar** on engineered NK cells in cancer, and **Dennis Watson** on metabolic crosstalk as a therapeutic target.


